Step-Ahead Mentors

Biology Undergraduate Society (BUGS) members and biology undergraduate students will serve as the step-ahead mentors.

Definition: A step-ahead mentor is usually an individual who is one hierarchical level above the protégé or in a position that would be the protégé's next logical step in their career progress (Darling, 1986).

<u>Protégés (students being mentored)</u>

Freshmen have been pre-selected based upon their participation in UNM's Living and Learning Communities (LLC), Biology Studies.

Volunteer Responsibilities of STEP AHEAD Mentors

- Commit 12 hours to work with student during the Fall 2010 semester.
- Attend a 1 hour program orientation. Update program coordinator of protégé's progress.
- Assist Project Step Ahead in completing program goals.
- Help students in developing their Research Quest Day posters.
- Serve as the "voice of experience" to LLC freshmen.
- Recognize when a student needs other assistance (i.e. tutoring, counseling).

Benefits of being a STEP AHEAD Mentors

- Gain experience for future student leadership and professional opportunities
- Develop improved communication skills.
- Earn double volunteer points with BUGS.
